



Using RAD to Reposition Your Portfolio

Curious whether the Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) is right for your community? This presentation by HUD staff from the Office of Recapitalization will cover how to use RAD to convert your properties from public housing to a long-term project-based Section 8 and assemble the financing to make investments and repairs to your property. This session is best for individuals with a basic understanding of RAD and different repositioning options; it will cover advanced topics such as how to combine RAD with Section 18 demolition/disposition, using RAD to transfer rental assistance from one property to another, and how to use RAD to build new units using your existing Faircloth authority.
